There will also be one to two pieces of curriculum based work either on My Maths or Rollama. These should be completed by pupils within a 45 minute time frame.

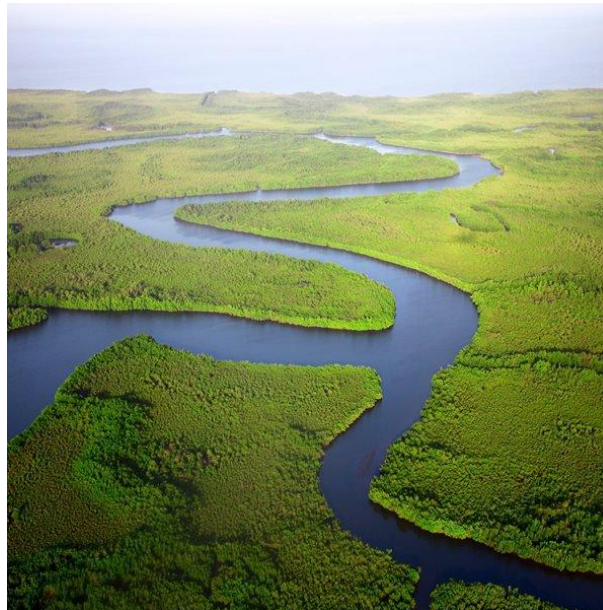
The children will also bring up to 10 words home for spelling homework. These should be learnt using the look/cover/write/check method.

Geography

Lots of our work this half term will link to Rivers. These books would be great to start building your child's knowledge



History

We will be learning about the Egyptians and these books would give your child some background information before we start.



Maths

We will be making close links and building upon the children's learning from year 3. We use a spiral curriculum where topics are frequently revisited.

Number and Place Value

- Counting in multiples of 100, 1000 & 6
- Knowing the value of each digit in a 4-digit number
- Comparing and ordering numbers beyond 1000
- Finding 10, 100 & 1000 more or less than a number

Addition and Subtraction

- Mentally adding and subtracting numbers
- Solve problems using number facts

Measurement

- Adding and subtracting money to give change
- Measuring and comparing lengths, mass and volume
- Adding and subtracting length, mass and volume
- Telling the time on an analogue clock to the nearest minute
- Reading time on a digital clock

Multiplication and Division

- Recall and use multiplication facts for 3, 4 & 8 times table
- Multiplying 3 numbers
- Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally

Fractions

- Working with tenths and hundredths
- Divide 1 & 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100
- Compare numbers with up to 2 decimal places

Geometry

- Describe 3-D shapes
- Identifying 2-D shapes on the surface of a 3-D shape
- Identifying horizontal, vertical, pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines.
- Describe positions on a 2-D grid

Addition and Subtraction

- Use inverse operations to check answers
- Add or subtract up to 4-digit numbers with formal written methods
- Two-step problems
- Choosing an appropriate method

English Reading

We will be looking at the range of texts pictured below to:

- Summarise the main details from the text by identifying the main ideas from more than one paragraph
- Discuss words and phrases that capture the readers interest and imagination
- Draw inferences
- Show understanding through intonation tone and volume
- Make links between texts and the wider world
- Retrieve and record information from the text

We kindly request that you avoid looking at these books with your children prior to them looking at them in school.

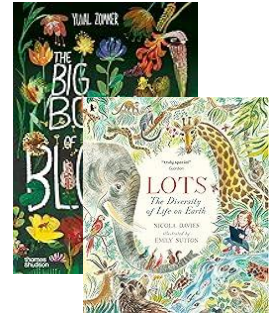
Narrative

Developing characters and setting through description, action and dialogue. Begin to organise ideas into paragraphs



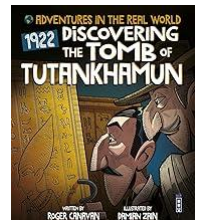
Non-Chronological Report

- Give examples of strategies to respond to being bullied

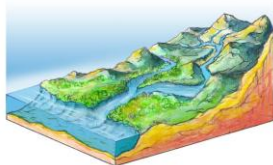
Valuing Difference
